### Denver Planning Board Sets April 21 Public Hearing on New Denver Zoning Code

The Denver Planning Board has confirmed the schedule for its April public hearing on Denver's new zoning code and map, setting the stage for City Council review and adoption in May and June as planned.

The Planning Board hearing will be Wednesday, April 21 at 1 p.m. at the Wellington E. Webb Municipal Building, 201 W. Colfax Ave. in fourth floor conference room 4.F.6. The public is invited to attend and share comments. Please note that this hearing starts earlier than regularly scheduled Planning Board meetings.

Those unable to attend will be able to view the hearing afterward on Denver TV8 and online.

Community Planning & Development staff will hold New Code Office Hours in conjunction with the hearing to answer specific questions from the public. If you plan to attend the New Code Office Hours, please reserve a time by registering at the following link: <http://www.surveymonkey.com/s/MXCCQLN>.

The Planning Board Public Hearing draft of the new code, map and a corresponding staff report will be available March 31 at <http://www.newcodedenver.org>. In response to community feedback, the City created an extra week (or a total of three weeks) for public review of these documents prior to the April 21 hearing.

Following the hearing, the Planning Board will prepare a recommendation to forward to City Council. The full timetable for the remainder of the New Code adoption process is as follows:

- April 21, 2010—Planning Board public hearing, followed by Board recommendation to City Council
- April 28, 2010—Blueprint Denver Committee consideration of new code
- May 24, 2010—City Council - first reading of proposed zoning code ordinance
- June 21, 2010—City Council - public hearing and final consideration of proposed ordinance adopting the new code

### 2010 Treecycle Mulch Giveaway & LeafDrop Compost Sale

Landscaping your yard just got cheaper!

On Saturday, May 1, 2010, the City & County of Denver will be holding its annual "Treecycle Mulch Giveaway & LeafDrop Compost Sale." The mulch is made by grinding up Christmas trees collected from residential homes this past January, and the compost is made from leaves collected in last fall's LeafDrop program. This event is an opportunity for Denver residents to save some cash on their landscaping projects this spring and reuse materials that otherwise would have been sent as trash to the landfill.

New this year: Recycle your plastic flower pots at Havana Nursery! Garden Centers of Colorado will be collecting plastic garden pots for recycling as part of this event. Plastic garden pots of any size or color, hanging baskets (with wires removed), carrying trays and flower pack holders will be accepted.

There will be five sites around Denver where residents can go to pick up FREE mulch on May 1st from 8 AM to 3 PM (or while supplies last):

- Havana Nursery (10450 Smith Rd., just south of I-70 on Havana St.) Loader service for trucks and trailers and dig-your-own mulch.
- Fred Thomas Park (Quebec St. & 26th Ave.) - Dig-your-own mulch.
- Sloan's Lake Park (Sheridan Blvd. & 17th Ave.) - Dig-your-own mulch.
- Veterans Park (Iowa St. & Vine St.) - Dig-your-own mulch.
- Creek Park (On Raleigh St. south of Dartmouth Ave.) - Dig-your-own mulch.

Compost will only be SOLD at the Havana Nursery site (10450 Smith Rd.) by AI Organics for the incredibly low price of \$3 per 10-gallon bag (about 40 pounds) or about \$30 per cubic yard (plus tax). Compost will only be available while supplies last, so come early and bring your own bags or containers if you plan on digging your own supply from the pile. Loader service for trucks and trailers will also be available for compost, and there will be a limit of 3-cubic yards of compost per vehicle.

Please remember:

- \* The event is for City & County of Denver residents only.
- \* Bring a shovel or pitchfork and your own bags or containers to collect your supply of mulch or compost if you plan on digging your own from the pile.
- \* Only the Havana Nursery site will have loader service (mulch & compost) for trucks and trailers.
- \* Residents loading material into trucks or trailers must bring along a tarp to make sure loads are covered before leaving the site.
- \* Only the Havana Nursery site will accept plastic flower pots for recycling. Plastic garden pots are also accepted for recycling anytime at local participating garden stores. For a list of participating stores visit online at [GardenCentersofColorado.org](http://GardenCentersofColorado.org)
- \* Commercial vehicles are prohibited from taking or selling the City's mulch.

## Safety Quiz for Parents

The National Center for Missing and Exploited Children, a private organization founded by John Walsh, that promotes child safety, provided the following safety quiz for parents.

1. What is one of the most important things you can do to keep your children safe?

Talking with your children and creating an atmosphere in which they feel safe coming to you and confiding information about an uncomfortable experience is the most important conversation you will ever have with them. Ensure that your children know that you will believe them and you will be responsive to them if they ever need your help.

2. How old are the most common victims of abduction and exploitation?

Teenagers-especially girls 12-19-are the most victimized segment of the U.S. population. They are victimized at a rate 84% higher than the general public.

3. According to police, what is one of most important tools in the search for a missing child?

In a recent survey of law enforcement nationwide, 98% of those police polled indicated that high-quality photographs of children are vital to any missing-child investigation. Police and child advocates agree that parents should keep up-to-date photos of their children (regardless of age), on hand at home in case of an emergency.

4. Who is the most likely individual to abduct your child?

Most child abductions are committed by people the children know or to whom they are related. The U.S. Department of Justice estimates that in the United States 354,600 children are kidnapped by a family member each year, and up to 5,000 are abducted by people who have at least some acquaintance with the child. Contrary to popular belief, the random abduction of children by strangers, as terrifying as they are, amount to an estimated 200 in the U.S. each year

5. Do posters of missing kids really work?

Yes, they work; however, your help is needed to make them work even better. Currently, one in seven missing children are recovered as a direct result of someone recognizing a picture of a missing child and alerting authorities. The National Center for Missing and Exploited Children is working to raise the awareness of the power of pictures in the search for missing children. Here's how you can help. Please study the pictures of children you see in your mail and in your daily routine. You might just help to reunite a family!

## Congress Park Update

DPR Capital Project Group plans to implement the Bond-funded rehabilitation of the Congress Park irrigation system this year. This work will include an upgrade of the irrigation system mainlines, pump, controllers, valves and heads throughout the athletic fields and surrounding turf and landscape areas. Construction will be accomplished with an in-house irrigation construction crew.

This rehabilitation project will be extensive and involve almost the complete replacement of the park's irrigation supply and distribution system. The upgrade will also provide for the future transfer of the irrigation water supply from a potable to a reuse water source. The duration of construction is expected to be 7 to 8 months.

This project had been on hold pending the culmination of the Central Recreation Center site selection process. Now that an alternate site has been selected for the Recreation Center, project design is in progress and construction schedule is being finalized. Due to the complexity of this project, this will be a 7-8 month construction duration.

Construction start May 3, 2010

Construction complete November 30, 2010.

All athletic fields will be closed for the duration of construction and all athletic teams and programs are working with our permit office to determine relocation options. Access to the parking lot, outdoor pool, tennis courts and playground will remain throughout the season. Restoration of the athletic fields will start early in 2011 and the turf will be in great shape for the entire 2011 spring, summer, and fall sports.

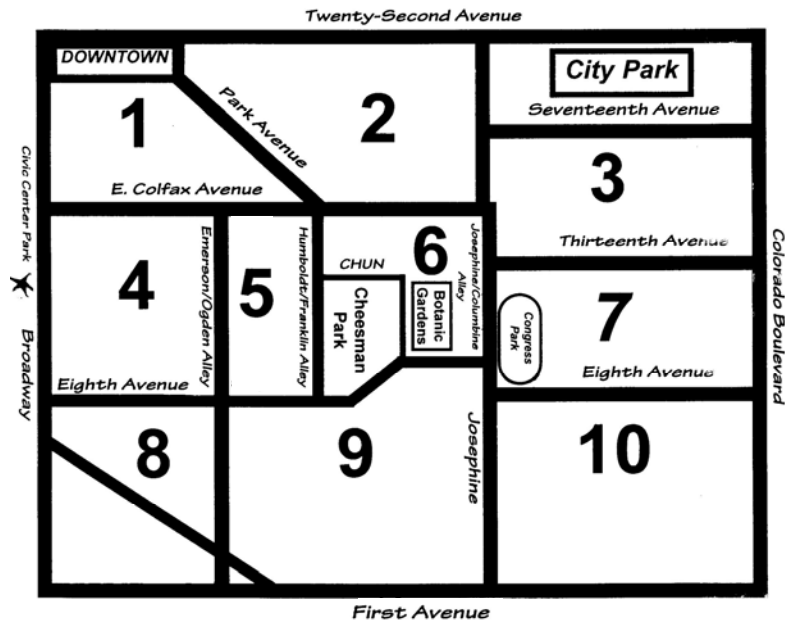
